Mr. Garrison was first admitted to our Home March 12, 190h and according to the application Jennie Carrison, whom we assume was his wife, was to be notified in the event of an energency, however, it is indicated at the time of his death that a friend, Mix Made Berning, 125 N. 9th St., Quincy, Illinois was notified.

The only disciplinary sotion against Wr. Garrison was on February 17, 1912 when he came in intoxicated and was subsequently discharged under sentence February 19, 1912.

This is the only information concerning the veteran that we have since records kept at the time he was a number were very scant.


