George Garrison, (0) of the town of *Virden*, in the County of *Macoupin*, and State of *Illinois*, formerly a Soldier of the United States of America, in the war *against* (1) *of the Rebellion*, respectfully asks that he be admitted as a member of said Home.

To enable the authorities to determine whether or not he is legally entitled to become a member of said Home, he declares and states the facts to be that he is now *74* years old; that he is _____ feet and _____ inches high; that he is of *Slavic* complexion, *Blue* eyes, and *Gray* hair; that he was born in the town of *Gene* in the *State of Kentucky*, on the *Not known* day of *Not known*, 1830, that he has been (2) _____ enrolled in the U. S. A. service; _____ in the war against _____, and _____ in the war of the late Rebellion; and that he has been (3) _____ honorably discharged from the service of the United States. That he has not heretofore been a member of any Soldiers', Sailors', or other Charitable Home or Institution, excepting the (6) _____

That he is now a bona fide resident of the State of Illinois, and has continuously lived and resided in said State for the last two years, or has served in an Illinois organization.

That he is so far disabled by (7) *Bad eyesight and old age* as to now be incapable of earning his own living.

That he has at all times, heretofore, supported and adhered to the government of the United States of America, and that he has not at any time been engaged in, or countenanced, or aided, or abetted, the cause of the late Rebellion.

That if he shall be admitted to be a member of the said Home, he will, in all things and in every respect, comply with and conform to the rules and regulations made, or that shall hereafter be made, for the government and discipline of the same; and that he will cheerfully do and perform any and all things that shall be required of him by those there in authority over him; and that he will promptly, and willingly, obey all lawful orders that he shall receive from any officer of the Home, so long as he shall remain a member thereof.

Enclosed is copy of Discharge Certificate of George Garrison who was born in Greene County, Kentucky in 1830 (month and date unknown) and expired in our hospital December 15, 1922 and was buried in our Home cemetery December 16, 1922.

Mr. Garrison was first admitted to our Home March 12, 1904 and according to the application Jennie Garrison, whom we assume was his wife, was to be notified in the event of an emergency, however, it is indicated at the time of his death that a friend, Miss Mada Berring, 125 N. 9th St., Quincy, Illinois was notified.

The only disciplinary action against Mr. Garrison was on February 17, 1912 when he came in intoxicated and was subsequently discharged under sentence February 19, 1912.

This is the only information concerning the veteran that we have since records kept at the time he was a member were very scant.

on the twelfth day of August, one thousand eight
hundred and sixty-one, to serve three years,
was Discharged from the service of the United States on the twenty-first
day of August, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-two,
by reason of Disability.

This Certificate is given under the provisions of the Act of Congress approved July 1,
1902, "to authorize the Secretary of War to furnish certificates in lieu of lost or destroyed
discharges," to honorably discharged officers or enlisted men or their widows, upon evidence that
